Subject: Your complaint CHAP(2018)03527 of 25 October 2018 against the Czech Republic

Dear Mr Ondràčka,

I refer to your complaint of 25 October 2018 relating to an alleged infringement by the Czech Republic of the provisions of Article 57 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) No $966/2012^1$ and Article 61 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) $2018/1046^2$, registered under number CHAP(2018)03527.

I would like to inform you that the Commission has decided to further examine your complaint as it raises issues that require it.

At this stage, the Commission is seeking to clarify the facts, in order to have a better overview of the situation and taking account of the fact that Member States have the primary responsibility, through their management and control systems, for the implementation of their programmes in shared management.

The Commission has requested and received information from the Czech authorities with respect to payments made from the European Structural and Investment Funds to companies belonging to the Agrofert group. In the light of the detailed data provided, the Commission is currently assessing the elements of the complaint and whether those payments have been made in full compliance with all relevant rules, including those on conflict of interests. The Commission has also launched audit procedures on the internal control systems and on their application to specific operations made by the Czech authorities.

In accordance with the rules on better relations with complainants³, the Commission should reach a decision to issue a formal notice or to close the case within the general time limit of one year from the date of registration of the complaint.

I will inform you once the examination of your complaint is completed and a decision on the follow-up has been taken.
